**Hope** – the church's insistent proclamation of the kingdom of God establishes the virtue of hope in the hearts of men and women. This hope unites people to God because they hope for that which they cannot acquire themselves, and such hope is founded on the promise of God.

**Action:** Consciously look for things for which to be grateful, offering God thanks for these, no matter how great or small.

**Liberation**– The church's preaching of liberation is based on Scripture. It is a liberation that includes respect for the human person and the common good of the people, and which, before everything else, turns to God as its sole source of hope and force.

**Action:** Reflect on how and whether your life manifests seeking the common good bringing to prayer whatever you discover.

**Forgiveness** –We all need to ask for forgiveness, and Jesus who without vengeance or resentment desires to harm no one-is on the cross, saying again: "Father, forgive them."

**Action:** Ask God to help you bring to mind all the people you need to forgive, and to give you the strength to do so.
