From Paul Welch:

The reports on conditions in our migrant detention camps bring into question the humanity of our immigration system. As Christians we cannot ignore the suffering of little children and adults fleeing from violence and poverty. Moreover we cannot ignore the suffering our own system has inflicted on these people – most of whom are Catholics. Christ is at the border with these suffering people.

We can do something. There is a national campaign – Lights for Liberty – whose website can be found at <https://www.lightsforliberty.org> and Syracuse NY.

On Friday, July 12, 2019, Lights for Liberty: at sites throughout America people will light the darkness with candles or flashlights to protest the inhumane treatment of immigrants in our detention centers. There will be gatherings at:

Binghamton- Temple Concord, 9 Riverside Dr. 13905 from 8:45-9:15pm.

Syracuse will have a rally Friday evening. Check the Lights for Liberty website for details.

If you can't make a rally, stand outside your home at 9:00pm and shine a light for Christ and his suffering immigrant people. Share this information with whomever you can.
